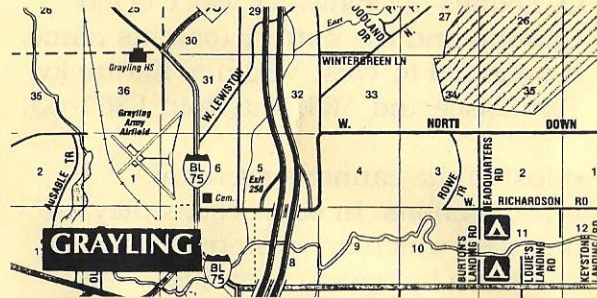


General Viewing Guide

- Artillery is not fired in any particular order. Units fire "at will", much as they did during wartime. To determine which artillery piece will fire next, watch for when the gun crew are in the position shown on the back photo. One crew member will use a long rope to fire the cannon most of the time.
- Visitors have the opportunity to observe historic artillery in use with various forms of inert projectiles, and experience the sights, smells and unique sounds of early artillery technology. They also have access to the highly skilled and experienced participants who are willing to share their knowledge. An information table will be manned at the control tower and Loomis Battery staff will help answer questions.
- **Ear protection & Binoculars are strongly recommended!** The firing is very loud and it tends to get rather smoky.
- Lawn chairs or blankets to sit on are suggested.
- This is a very casual event; bring sunscreen, a lawn umbrella and stay all day!
- Do not approach competitors while the match is in progress. Please stay behind the yellow line, for your own safety.

Location: Range 35/Camp Grayling located Northeast of Grayling off of North Down River Road, 5 1/2 miles from Downtown Grayling.

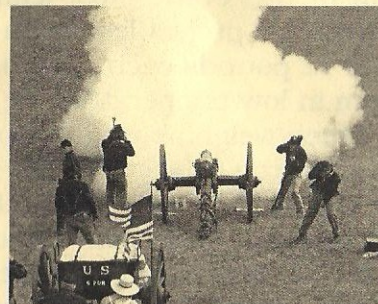

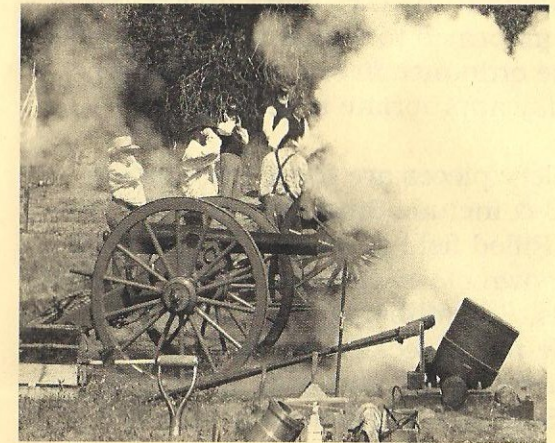
