BREAST CANCER AWARENESS BENEFIT SHOOT

October 9-10, 2010

Dear ACWSA Members and families,

For our October shoot, in observance of Breast Cancer Awareness Month, we heartily invite you to the Richmond Sportsmen's Clubs for an event dedicated to raising funds for breast cancer research. Some of our wives, daughters, and friends have suffered from this deadly disease and with that in mind we have put together a full weekend with a lot of shooting and several fundraisers and raffles. ALL FUNDS RAISED will be donated in the name of the ACWSA to the National Breast Cancer Foundation (www.nationalbreastcancer.org/)

You'll notice we have raised the entry fees modestly for this reason, for this shoot only. Additionally to add to the funds raised for this cause we are asking that anyone who is willing to seek sponsors who will donate funds based on your shooting. In other organizations sponsors donate funds for each mile walked, or ran, or whatever. In our case we are asking you to seek a sponsor who will contribute based on the number of targets you break or how many seconds your team shoots. Forms will be provided for this purpose at a future date but with enough lead time before the shoot to raise funds.

Additionally, we have put together some novel events that will be run on Saturday morning to raise funds for the cause. You can shoot at breakable targets and earn a chance to win prizes in our raffle board. You can challenge your teammate or heated rival with our challenge match to see who can hit their targets first. Buy a golf ball to enter a 50/50 event where all golf balls will be fired at one time from an 8 inch siege mortar - the ball that lands closest to the stake will be the winner. Buy a square in our canister round turkey shoot and see if you can win. More to come! Again, ALL FUNDS RAISED will be donated to the National Breast Cancer Foundation (www.nationalbreastcancer.org/)

Keeping with the spirit of Breast Cancer Awareness - ALL TARGETING will be **PINK!**

Free camping will be available at the range. We ask that you use the porta-johns instead of the club house restrooms.
